REF G 1201.S5 A8 1986

Atlas for the American Civil War

Detailed color maps of campaigns, troop movements, routes of march, battle sites for artillery, cavalry, infantry.

REF G 1201.S1 A8 1984

Atlas of American History

Covers American history, from the time of Western discovery and Indian Tribal Groups, to 1978-1984 period of issues (unemployment, hazardous waste, etc.). Includes settlement of country, French and Spanish exploration, American Revolution, Civil War, Frontier era, U.S. as a World Power. Some social and economic development maps, such as the Interstate Highway System (1984) and sources of immigration.

Civil War Maps: An annotated List of Maps and Atlases in the Library of Congress.

descriptions of 2,240 maps and charts, and of 76 atlases and sketch books. Theater of war maps; maps, charts on troop movements, coastal charts; reconnaissance. Maps themselves are not included.

"Goldentree Bibliographies in American History"

Citations for books and articles that cover the title time period. Subjects include economic and social development, British background, institutional and governmental policy, administration in and of the colonies, state and regional histories, commerce, and other topics.

REF E 77.W52 1995American Indian Studies: A Bibliographic Guide.

Includes an appendix, with listings of LC Subject headings used; also, a Subject Index and an Author /Title Index. Contents include citations for encyclopedias, directories, books, bibliographies, guides to the literature, periodicals indexes, abstracts, newspapers, newsletters, government publications, theses and dissertations, microfilm collections. Subjects that these citations cover include material on various tribes, practices, public and government policy, anthropology, history, etc.

Divided chronologically, by major periods of Southern history, and by subject - society, politics, education, race, law, economy, etc. Includes Subject and Author Indexes. Citations for entries of journal articles are abstracted.

REF E 178.B48 1988Bibliographies in History: An Index to Bibliographies in History Journals and Dissertations Covering the U.S. and Canada

Divided chronologically, by regions and by source type of materials; includes methodology, research, teaching of history, archives, museums, libraries, and collections. A bibliography of bibliographies; abstracts.

REF E 303.F47Confederation, constitution, and Early National Period, 1781-1815"Goldentree Bibliographies in American History"

Article and book citations. Subjects included: Confederation, Constitution formation, analysis, and ratification, Federalism, the Republican Era, War of 1812, development of governmental, political, and social thought, demography of nation, economic development, social problems, slavery, Humanitarianism, science, arts, etc.

REF E 174.D52 2003Dictionary of American History

With the goal of "making the voluminous record of the past readily available in one convenient source" (p. xv Preface). The Dictionary contains articles arranged alphabetically. Articles are brief, contain cross referencing, and are followed by a bibliography. There are no biographical entries.

REF E 661.D4The Gilded Age: 1877-1896"Goldentree Bibliographies in American History"

Bibliography of references significant to research on the "Gilded Age" in American history; citations for journals and books. Listings of resources under subject topic areas - politics, foreign affairs, industry, trust and monopolies, immigration, labor, rise of the city, natural resources, science and medicine, journalism, others.

REF Z 1215.U53A Guide to the Study of the United States of America: Representative Books Reflecting the development of American Life and Thought

Sections on U.S. general History, local and regional history, philosophy, military history, law and justice, society, culture, economic life, education, politics, etc. Bibliography of books, including Library of Congress call numbers and libraries the items located in, if available. Index, at back of volume.

REF E 338.F43Manifest Destiny and the Coming of the Civil War: 1840-1861

"Goldentree Bibliographies in American History"

Citations for the title period, of journal articles and books. Covers the subject areas of : general works, Westward expansion, American society and economy, government and politics, slavery and sectional conflict, more.

REF E 660.D66The Nation in Crisis 1861-1877

"Goldentree Bibliographies in American History"

Sources for information on the American civil War and Reconstruction eras; citations for books and journals. Topic areas include the outbreak of the Civil War, politics, the War at sea, states during reconstruction, the Confederacy, wartime diplomacy, and Grant's Administration.

REF E 178.W74 1918-Writings on American History

Later volumes have Author and Name Indexes; also, Subject Bibliographies of books and monographs for writings on American history. The personal name indexes give number citations to entries in other volumes. Citations provide some abstracting of the works, some description.

International in scope. biographies, photographs of the lives, accomplishments, work, awards, other details concerning prominent persons in every field of endeavor. Includes obituaries.

REF E 176.D562Dictionary of American Biography

Scholarly articles; includes noteworthy persons of all periods who lived in the United States. Indexes; some inaccuracies.

REF CT 3260.N57 (Three volumes and **REF CT 3260. N573** (One volume)
Notable American Women: 1607-1950 (A Biographical Dictionary) and Notable American Women: The Modern Period

These titles are alphabetically organized, and include scholarly article format biographies of women prominent in American history; bibliographies with some of the articles. The second title is a supplement, and includes biographies from the late nineteenth century to the mid twentieth century.

Who's Who in America

Alphabetical listing, short biographies of influential and famous Americans. Editions since 1994 have geographic, professional, retiree and necrology indexes. Inclusion in the latest issues depends much on position held, and on notable achievements.

REF E 747.W59 1966-
Who's Who in the East

Listings of persons prominent and influential in the Eastern United States; biographical sketches.

REF E 747.W63 1965-1989
Who's Who in the Midwest

Listings of prominent Midwesterners; short biographical sketches.

REF F 208.W64 1950-
Who's Who in the South and Southwest 1965-1989, 1991-1994

Includes biographical sketches for Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Mexico. As in other Who's Who volumes, the persons included are prominent in all fields; science, arts, professions, religion, media, industry, health care, finance, government, law, education, athletics, etc.

Who Was Who in America

Short, biographical sketches of deceased Americans, covering the time periods from 1607 to the 1990's. Some world notables included.

Compilations, Directories, Handbooks, Research Guides, Yearbooks

REF E 178.5.A48 1969
Album of American History

Drawings, diagrams, pictures of United States historical events, people, objects; time period covered by volumes, from colonial to late 1960's. Some portraits; not much text. Index in Volume six.

REF E 159.A37 1995America Preserved: A checklist of Historic Buildings, Structures, and Sites

Alphabetically arranged, by state, then by counties. Index at end, by state and city or town (counties listed behind the city or town). Offers name, address, survey numbers and Library of Congress shelflist numbers.

REF D 2.A7The Annual Register (A Record of World Events) 1963-

International in scope. Covers events, topics of science, religion, law, arts, economics, other areas. includes maps and obituaries, chronicles of principle events; indexed.

REF 470.B29 1989Battle Chronicles of the Civil War: 1861-1865

The first five volumes cover each year of the Civil War; the sixth includes war leaders and the index. Text descriptions, diagrams and maps. Illustrated.

REF E 468.L48 1986Civil War Manuscripts: Guide to Collections on the Civil War, in the Manuscript Division of the Library of Congress.

Descriptions of manuscript items; index at back of volume.

REF E 172.A538 (1982)Directory of Historical Societies and Agencies in the United States and Canada

Lists, by state or province, phone numbers, addresses, dates of founding, major programs, newsletters, periods of time covered. Special interest (subject) index at back, listing institutes for varying areas of historical interest.

REF E 173.C66 1977cDocuments of American History

Documents cover subjects ranging from the age of discovery to the present; mostly, the documents are of official or quasi official type. Indexed. Examples of contents: Marbury vs. Madison, Northwest Ordinance, Lee's Farewell to his Army speech, Lincoln-Douglas debates, colonial charters, Monroe Doctrine, Roosevelt's new nationalism speech (1912), Teapot Dome, military occupation of Japan (1945), Taft-Hartley Act, reports of Berlin Crisis, and the Cuban Missile Crisis, etc.

REF E 176.1.K3 1993Facts About the Presidents

Presidents from Washington to Carter. Part I focuses on information concerning each president, presented in chronological order. Facts include elections and nominations data, administration dates and events, information on the vice president, congress, other data. Part II concentrates on presenting comparative data for all the Presidents, such as, dates and places of national conventions, presidential libraries, information on children and wives, appointments, etc.

REF CD 3022.A45 (1961)A Guide to Archives and Manuscripts in the United States

Guide arranged by state and cities, then by archives. Indexed. Not a complete listing of all archives or of all holdings. Very brief descriptions. Bibliography citations included with many holdings listings; these indicate sources that have more information.

REF CD 3023.U54 1974Guide to the National Archives of the United States

Non-current records of the United States government, "which document our history from the First Continental Congress and include the basic records of the three branches of our Federal government..." (p.vii)

REF E 178.P78 1987Handbook for Research in American History: A Guide to Bibliographies and Other Reference Works

Guide to dictionaries, handbooks, encyclopedias, archive records, state and local materials, guides to dissertations and theses, to newspapers, to periodical literature, general bibliographies, book review indexes, manuscript guides, special library catalogs; citations are NOT for specific topics in American history, but to list sources that provide sources of citation information on various aspects of American history. Part II deals with special subject areas of historical research, such as religion, women, politics, society, etc.

REF E 839.53.H57 1972-Historic Documents

Current documents of historical importance, current to the year of the volume in which they are printed. Background information on the documents is included.

REF HA 202.B87 1975Historical Statistics of the United States: Colonial Times to 1970

Tables of statistics, with Subject Index. Information includes historical information on population, labor, migration, social statistics, national income and wealth, transportation, business enterprises, government, services, manufacturing, housing, etc.

REF CD 3052.N37 1990Microfilm Publications in the National Archives - Southeast Region

Subject Index, and a list of microfilm publication arranged alphabetically - by titles of record groups. Lists 16 and 35 mm microfilm in the entries. Subjects of the microform publication include such topics as World War II, confiscated German records from WWII, records of the Continental Congress 1774-1789), federal administration of Indian affairs.

REF HB 1965.K8Population Redistribution and Economic Growth: United States, 1870-1950

Migration data, redistribution of income, statistics on labor forces, manufacturing, general population. State income estimates furnished, for such fields as agriculture, non-agricultural, construction, transportation. Stats on migration for blacks, whites, foreign born.

REF HP 235.U6 V35 1999The Value of a Dollar: 1860-1999

Compilations of statistics for comparison of prices of goods and services, for 1860 through 1999. Brief historical "snapshots" of each time period presented. What is included? Prices for foods, clothing, entertainment, furniture, rent, housing, appliances, motorized vehicles and equipment. Also, some statistics about investments and stock yields.

Dictionaries and Encyclopedias

REF E 185.86.B542 1993Black Women in America

Short entries or articles, with bibliographies at the end of the entries. Cross referenced. Concentrates on personalities mostly, with some presentation of associations or other topics, such as free black women in the ante-bellum north, international councils of black women, etc.

REF E 185.H64 1991Chronology of African-American History: Significant Events and People from 1619 to the Present

Chronological, brief entry arrangement. Appendix includes excerpts from documents, speeches, etc. of significance to black history. Topics include: laws, Emancipation Proclamation, statutes, Amendments thirteen through fifteen of the U.S. Constitution, "Jim Crow" provisions of Civil Rights Act of 1964, excerpts from Dr. Martin Luther King's speeches, opinions of various Supreme Courts.

REF E 76.2.L44A Concise Dictionary of Indian Tribes of North America

Short entries, some with bibliographies. Cross referenced, with glossary, index, maps of culture and language groups, Indian lands and communities, regional maps.

REF E 441.D53 1988Dictionary of Afro-American Slavery

Short articles, alphabetically arranged; bibliographies with entries. General index at back. General and scholarly use - broad range of topics. Three hundred articles, on regional, economic, social, political, intellectual, philosophical aspects of slavery.

REF E 208.B68Encyclopedia of the American Revolution

Maps, diagrams; index to the maps. Articles, with bibliographies, ...on the people, issues, and events of the American revolutionary era." (Frontspiece) Covers political, social, and military aspects.

REF E 487.E55 1993Encyclopedia of the Confederacy

Articles, with bibliographies. For general and research use. Topics of reference include social, cultural, political, and military overviews of the South during the Confederacy's existence.

REF E 740.7.E53 1996Encyclopedia of the United States in the Twentieth Century

Chronological event listing in Volume I. Long articles, with bibliographies. Topics include: The American people, politics, culture, and economy, global America, medicine, science/technology of this century.

REF E 332.82 1967The Jeffersonian Cyclopeda: A comprehensive collection of the Views of Thomas Jefferson Classified and Arranged in Alphabetical Order Under Nine Thousand Titles; Relating to Government, Politics, Law, Education, Political Economy, Finance, Science, Art, Literature, Religious freedom, Morals, Etc.

Beneath entries (usually short entries), there are notations as to whom and when the opinion was ventured.

REF E 184.J5 J48 1992Jewish American History and Culture: An Encyclopedia

Short entries, bibliographies included with the articles. Indexed. Focus on events, some terms, personalities and associations connected with Jewish Americans. Includes subjects of music, medicine, journalism, fiction, social sciences.

REF E 76.2.R4 1995Reference Encyclopedia of the American Indian

The second volume is a "Who's Who" of prominent and influential Native Americans. Arranged alphabetically by name, and includes a geographical index. The first volume is in two parts. The first part lists organizations, associations, governmental agencies, reservations, tribal councils, museum/library collections, schools, periodicals, other entities associated with Native Americans. the second part is a bibliography, arranged into subject categories, with titles.

The 1990 Census Atlas of North Carolina

Maps of state, and of the counties in the state. Covers topics by states and counties; map/graphic illustrations. Topics include: Gender/Family, Ethnicity, Taxes, Income and Poverty, Medical Information, Politics, Employment, Age, Population Characteristics, Housing, etc.

REF CD 3420.A7 1993

Archival and Manuscript Repositories in North Carolina: A Directory

County index, map. Institutional name index. Addresses, descriptions, services available, hours, phone numbers listed.

REF F 253.A8 21

Biographical History of North Carolina: From Colonial Times to the Present

Textbook format; articles on persons prominent in North Carolina, and the times they influenced. History presented through biographies.

REF F 268.C992

Cyclopedia of Eminent and Representative Men of the Carolinas of the Nineteenth Century Volume 2; North Carolina

Biographical sketches; some portraits.

REF CT 252.D5

Dictionary of North Carolina Biography

Short articles on North Carolinians who have attained prominence and/or influence. Bibliographies with some of the articles. People included who were born and lived in North Carolina, but also included are those who were born elsewhere or native North Carolinians who moved elsewhere - as long as they influenced North Carolina's history.

The Encyclopedia of North Carolina

Short entry format; information on pre-history, geography, history, governors, historical sites, state constitution of North Carolina. Indexed, includes map of North Carolina.

REF F 262.A15 N63 1969

Formation of the North Carolina Counties: 1663-1943

Brief descriptions of county formations, with footnoting as to sources. Indexed, maps in Appendix II.

REF CD 3424.C34 1981Guide to Private Manuscript Collections in the North Carolina State Archives

Description of collections, information on history of items. Private papers, microfilm private collections, private accounts. Index guide at back of the volume - guide to collections.

REF CD 3424.N67 1997Guide to Research Materials in the North Carolina State Archives

Alphabetically arranged, county by county.

REF F 254.C74North Carolina

History from 1584 onwards; textbook format. Descriptions of the area Indians, colonialism, independence, the Whig era, social history, sectional controversies, humanitarian reforms, slavery, Civil War and Reconstruction, Home Rule, new economic structures, social rehabilitation and new commonwealth, among other topics.

REF F 254.N963 1988The North Carolina Almanac and Book of Facts

Index at front of volume. Alphabetically arranged areas in volume; subjects include famous North Carolinians, roanoke settlement, taxes, tourist attractions, labor, the state constitution, climate, etc.

REF F 252.P6The North Carolina Gazetteer

"The North Carolina Gazetteer is a geographical dictionary in which an attempt has been made to list all of the geographic features of the state in one alphabet. It is current and it is historical as well. (p. vii - Preface)

REF F 253.N8612 1974North Carolina governors 1585-1974 (Brief Sketches)

Appendixes of such details as governors in colonial councils, chief executives of North Carolina, colonial governors, wartime governors, ordinary occupations of governors, military service, more.

REF F 254.J66 1995North Carolina History: An Annotated Bibliography

Index to Authors and to Subjects. Divided into sections of bibliographic citations. The subjects of the sections include colonial periods, pre-history, the Civil War, Revolutionary War, county and local history, historic resources, economic and social history, etc.

REF F 254.S74 1984North Carolina Local History: A Select Bibliography

Index of citations for works covering individual counties (Part II) and for general works (Part I), which cover all counties or specific areas, such as the piedmont. Bibliographical citations from indexes, bibliographies, guides, handbooks, and cartographic aids.

REF JK 4130.N6 2001-2002North Carolina Manual: 2001-2002

Directory of state government, state symbols, historical miscellanea, the constitution., Information of colleges, counties, election results, voting, the Republican and Democratic parties. Basic statistics on the North Carolina population - from the 2000 census.

REF E 573.4.M36North Carolina Troops 1861-1865: A Roster

Listed by companies and battalions. Short bios on some of the soldiers; information included on rank, status, when each troop was last present and accounted for in the records. Volumes cover companies, by their various services: artillery, cavalry, infantry. Units are listed numerically. General indexes of names included for the volumes.
